Swan Hill Agents offered a good quality yarding this week seeing quotations 20c/kg to 30c/kg dearer than seen a fortnight ago. Feeder cattle remained firm to a shade easier producing similar number to 2 weeks ago. The quality of cattle yarded ranged from fair to excellent. Trade Veal & grain-fed calves made from 550c/kg to 635c/kg while Cows ranged from 340c/kg to 370c/kg in a sale well supported sale.

In addition to creating solid friendships, cows remember bad experiences and the animals (including people) attached to them. So yes, cows hold grudges that sometimes last for life

Animal welfare researchers at Bristol University found that cows have surprising and complex emotional intelligence. If you do them wrong or cause them pain, cows remember it for years and may never let it go. A cow might hold a grudge against its owners if it's moved to a new location, especially if moved away from its friends.

Likewise, bulls hold grudges against other aggressive males. The depth of emotion and attachment all animals feel isn't exclusive to cows, but cows pay close attention to how you treat them. If you're the source of a slight or their suffering, they are not likely to forgive and forget.
