Did you know?

Cows have a strong sense of smell. They can perceive smells at a distance of up to ten kilometres. Compared to the hearing of humans, the hearing ability of cows is better in the deep and high frequency ranges.

Cows are moving constantly during grazing and can cover 13 km per day. Besides the 'mooring' cows use their body language, such as the position of the head, limbs and tail, as well as facial expressions, in order to communicate.
