## Prime Cattle Sale 8<sup>th</sup> of August 2024



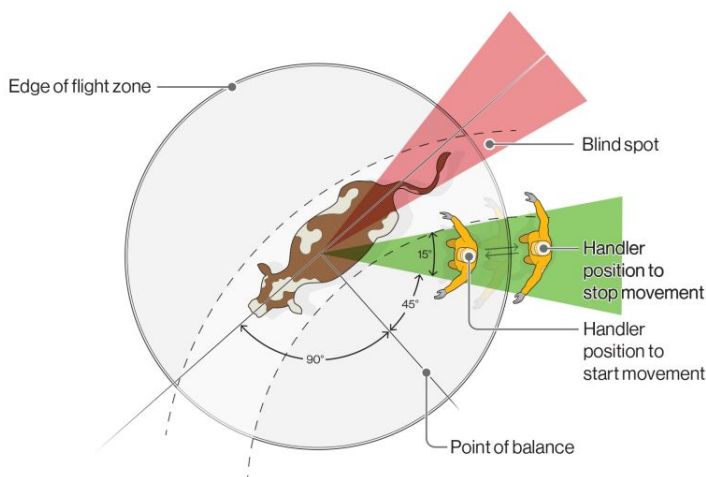
Total Yarding of **657** head

A similar size yarding to a fortnight ago with some excellent runs of Grain Fed cattle on offer. Cows sold to strong demand to be 10-30c/kg dearer topping at 348c/kg. There were limited Bullocks to quote, however a very good run of Grain Fed Cattle from 400-550kg that sold slightly discounted on 3 weeks ago. This category sold firm to 8c/kg cheaper. Feeder Cattle finished dearer by 20-40c/kg.

### Did you know?



The flight zone boundary and the point of balance are crucial to low stress stock handling. All handlers need to understand cattle behaviour, particularly the flight zone of cattle, both in theory and practice before working independently with cattle.

Position and movement are key. A cattle handler working the flight zone appropriately can turn cattle exactly when needed, but someone positioned wrongly can cause havoc.
