 Up to 10 penalty units can apply.

The personal information requested on this form is being collected by Council for the provision of dog registration. This information will be used solely for animal registration and identification purposes. If this information is not collected, then this may impact on the assessment of the registration. The applicant understands that the personal information provided is for animal registration only, and that he or she may apply to Council for access to and/or amendments to the information. The applicant may apply to Council for access and/or amendment of the information.

Registration fees are due on 10 April annually

State Government legislation requires councils to register and control cats and dogs that are over the age of three months. If you are the owner of any cats or dogs over three months of age, they must all be registered with Council.

The registration of any dog or cat is subject to compliance with the Domestic Animals Act 1994. Council's Community Local Law Number 2 restricts the quantities of animals which can be kept on a property in the municipal district. The quantities permitted can be located in Section 71 of the Local Law.

A permit must be obtained from Council if you wish to have more than the specified amount of animals at your property.

All dogs and cats must be implanted with a microchip before Council can accept the registration (a requirement since May 2007).

The fee set by Council to register a dog or cat is \$132 per animal per year.

If your animal meets one or more of the following you will be eligible for a reduced fee.

If the animal is:	The fee is reduced to:
Desexed (certificate or letter from Vet required)	\$44
Over 10 years of age*	\$44
Part of a domestic animal business or applicable organisation (copy of credentials required)	\$44
A dog that has undergone training (copy of credentials required)	\$44
A working dog* To be eligible, the dog must be used primarily for the purpose of droving, tending, working or protecting stock. Livestock is defined as cattle, horses, sheep, pigs and goats.	\$22

* Proof required

- For a working dog— proof can be a statutory declaration, documentation to show the dog owner is a primary producer or uses the dog for employment purposes, or a tax invoice for the purchase stock.
- For a dog or cat over 10 years of age— proof can be a statutory declaration, letter form a vet, Council registration form, or documentation from a registered breeder.
- Other types of proof may be considered at the discretion of Council's Authorised Officers.

Eligible pension card holders will also receive a 50% discount on the calculated amount. Eligible pension cards are Centrelink Pensioner Card or Repatriation Health Card.

The fee for a Restricted Breed Dog, Dangerous Dog or Menacing Dog is **\$220**. Owners of these animals are not entitled to reduced fees.

Registration tag replacement fee is **\$5**

Fines will also apply for animals found wandering at large by Council's Authorised Officers.

- Statewide set fee for a dog at large during the daytime **\$242**
- Statewide set fee for a dog at large during night time **\$322**
- Statewide set fee for cat found in a restricted district **\$81**
- Council pound release fee **\$75** per animal, plus **\$10** sustenance per day.
